#### **COMPETITION & FISHING RULES**

- · No fishing that utilises a helicopter
- Any competitor found not abiding by competition and fishing rules will be disqualified from competition with no refund of entry fees.
- Any misuse of the boat ramp ie parking to cause congestion, blocking of other competitor boats, aggressive behaviour will likely result in disqualification of the team.



#### SCORING, PHOTOS, LANYARDS, BRAG MAT

- All scoring fish caught during this competition will need to be photographed on the 2024 measuring mat provided, with individual lanyard laid on top of the fish so that competitor name is clear.
- Scoring will be completed via the Track My Fish for Tournaments app (No paper score sheets will be available or accepted)
- Photographs need to be taken from within the new Track My Fish for Tournament app, not in your camera roll. TMFTournament. Please ensure you have downloaded the app in the lead up to the comp.
- Official brag mat for all competition fish photos will be provided in your competition bag, please ensure you check your competition bag before departing Timber Creek.
- KGFC Big Horse Barra Classic committee members and or KGFC members WILL NOT be responsible or liable for loss of damages to phones/ipads and or photographic equipment during KGFC Big Horse Barra Classic competition.
- Photos can only be uploaded into the App during fishing times as stated on page 15.

#### **FISH**

- All competition fish accepted will be Catch & Release ONLY
- Fish must be legally released to be eligible for entry into any category of competition.
- Only the below fish species will be eligible for entry into any category in competition. Barramundi, Jewfish, Salmon, Catfish, Mullet (Juniors & Poddy Mullet ONLY)
- NO set lines or nets are to be used by competitors to catch competition fish. Competitor's lines are to be always attended to.
- Anglers may ONLY fish with a maximum of 2 lines at a time, these can be of any combination.
- Fish shall NOT be gaffed then recorded and released.
- Smallest Barramundi caught with a hook (cast net catches not accepted) photo evidence to be emailed to KGFC.





KGFC has the right to substitute any prize with one of equal or near equal value. All prize values are based upon recommended retail inc GST. Teams - If there are two Major Prize winners, the prize is to be split at the discretion of the Committee

- Winners of each category DO NOT have to be present at the presentation evening to collect their prizes. Please ensure contact details are on registration forms.
- KGFC Lure biggest fish prize is a fun and honest prize where a photo as evidence is to show the lure attached to the fish in the water and another photo to show the length. There will need to be a witness also.
- To be eligible for the Team Fishing categories fishing must be carried out in the same location e.g. same boat or land area—cannot be split up into different areas/boats.
- Team events are judged on fish species and point system, (can be a combination of all these fish species) Barramundi, Jewfish, Salmon, Catfish
- Teams can consist of a combination of male and female, and or Junior/Sub Junior competitors.
- KGFC Big Horse Barra Classic weigh master's decision is final. Any protests are to be in writing and to be presented to weigh master within 1/2 hour of close on Sunday. A protest fee of \$100 will be payable to lodge a protest.
- Honesty is required by parents in that Juniors and Poddy Mullet catch their own fish and are not entering fish caught by parents or other team members.
- Teams with day use of the boat ramp get priority parking at the boat ramp!!!
- River campers are kindly asked that they consider those accessing the boat ramp daily by parking their vehicle away from the boat ramp towards the highway.

#### TRACK MY FISH FOR TOURNAMENTS APP - 2024 BIG HORSE CLASSIC

#### **Prepare for the Event**

Download the Track My Fish for Tournament app from Google Play or Apple App store. If you have already downloaded the app, check for updates. TMF must be used in the most current update & your phone must have current software. Open TMF pop ups will appear.

Have you used TMF apps before?

- Yes enter email / password and login
- No click to sign up

If you get any pop ups advising invalid username or password or screen name not available, please use the forgot my password in app.

Select your group > KATHERINE GAME FISHING CLUB > ENTER

Click Record Catch > Choose the event you would like to fish in, and press ENTER.

Log your Catch When you open TMF the photo screen appears.

PHOTOSTREAM | make sure the save to camera roll the top of the screen is ON (set to green). This enables your photos to save to your phone on the gallery as well as upload into the application after submitting.

OFFLINE MODE | turn your phone to offline mode. This saves your battery power and use in low mobile reception. To go offline, click the green button: when you are back in good phone reception go online & follow the prompts, check your scorecard & log for submission updates.

**LOG YOUR CATCH** | take a clear photo through the app as per the events rules. Press the tick, then if you wish to take a glory photo follow the process. If you have save to camera roll turned on this should save to your phone. Check & trial before the event. It takes you to the data entry page.

At the bottom of the screen enter the fish details: • Fisher – if you would like to submit a fish for another angler you click here and type their first and last name. In verification process it will be switched to them, please read the the scorecard details about the status of fish submission.

- · Select the species
- Enter length in CM
- $\bullet$  Once all the photos and data are loaded, press SUBMIT button

#### **Check your submissions**

In the catch screen where you submit your catches in the top right there is a log button, when clicked you can see all the fish submitted, if not showing green received then you are either offline or not enough mobile reception, you can press submit all when to try again when in good mobile service.

#### **Check the Status of your Submissions**

On the screen under RECORD CATCH, there is a EVENT INFO tab, click this & you can see the live accepted catches, the scoreboard of accepted catches and the scorecard which is the live status of your submissions.

If you see ACCEPTED IMAGE RECEIVED, it is the confirmation that the scores in the background have been accepted by the score if you see SUBMITTED IMAGE RECEIVED, it means the data & image have been received but the score checker is yet

and accept your entry. This simply means the data is to be checked.

If you see **SUBMITTED IMAGE NOT RECEIVED**, it means the data has been received but your photo hat you will need to check your mobile reception and head back into the log screen or contact us to check for you if unsure.

#### FISHING BOUNDARIES

Please refer to Map on page 32. The competition area is between SALTWATER YARDS above Timber Creek and down to LOBBY CREEK. The BAINES (East & West Junction).

#### Fishing access granted to Angalarri River for the 2024 Comp!!!

Conditions of access - please do the right thing and don't wrack it for everyone!

- Access to the Angalarri River is restricted to registered competitors participating in the competition, and any event safety vessels including NT Water Police.
- Access is restricted to this specific competition, from 6am Saturday 4th of May to 3pm Sunday 5th of May 2024.
- Competition participants are to establish communications with Range Control (via VHF radio channel 69 or 0427 185 058) on entry and exit to the Angalarri River, providing their callsign and number of boat occupants.
- Access up the Angalarri River is not to extend beyond the Angalarri River Crossing (approximately 19km in a straight line), upstream from the confluence of the Angalarri and Victoria Rivers. The boundary will be marked by Defence, with signage on the river bank.
- Competitors' boats and occupants must remain on the water at all times.

The event organiser and competition participants are required to cooperate with, and follow the directions of Defence's dedicated representative on

Mob: 0427 185 058. Major Battese will be at Bradshaw Field Training Area for the duration of the competition. Please refer to competition map on page 32. Note: Delays may occur due to congestion at boat ramp so please consider this when calculating your return after close of fishing, especially at the close of competition on Sunday.

#### **BOATS**

All boats must carry safety equipment as required by Marine safe NT. It is the responsibility of each competitor to acquaint themselves with these requirements. NT Water police will be on the river and at the boat ramp checking compliance. Any boat not having the required safety equipment will result in competitors fishing in that boat being ineligible for prizes for fish entered whilst the boat is non-compliant.

#### LIABILITY

KGFC will not accept any liability for any injury, loss, or damage of any kind. It will be the responsibility of each skipper, crew, and entrant whether or not to start or continue the Competition. Due to legal liability requirements each entrant will need to read the acknowledgements on the entry form, watch a safety briefing and acknowledge a liability waiver.

#### **SAFETY**

All competitors must comply with NT Safety Guide For Recreational and Pleasure with particular reference to safety equipment, safe operation and speed limits. Refer NT Maritime Marine Safety Guide (nt.gov.au). If organizers deem weather conditions unsuitable KGFC reserves the right to cancel event in whole or part, this will be announced via Facebook, and on the website. It is up to the competitors to monitor Facebook and the website.

#### - HOTOGRAPHING FISH

- All scoring fish caught during this competition will need to be photographed within the Track My Fish for Tournaments app (details page 11-13) on the 2024 measuring mat provided, with individual lanyard laid on top of the fish so that competitors name is clear.
- Species with a paddle tail (Barramundi Jewfish) measure from the head of measuring board to end of tail.
- Species with a fork tail (Salmon) measure from the head of measuring board to the centre of fork tail.
- NOTE: the fish head must be in contact with the end of the measuring board and the mouth closed. Photographs must be taken from directly above the fishes head and showing the whole fish on the board in the one photograph.

For the competition the 2024 Brag Mat and individual lanyard must be clearly visible in the photograph. Failure to photograph fish to requirements will likely make that capture disallowed.

#### HINTS FOR BETTER PHOTOS

Place the whole fish in a sunny position – not half in sun & half in shade. Ensure the angle of the shot has no bright reflections from the fish.

#### One second, one storm, one accident - Arnhem Highway

#### The accident

The lives of a beloved, humble, and community-spirited family changed forever on Australia Day. Dedicated fishing enthusiasts Charles, Mary-Lou and two of their three sons headed east from rural Darwin bound for a day's fishing at Shady Camp. On a sweeping bend, in a monsoonal downpour, an oncoming car hit them head-on.

When the car came to rest, Willard, 11, and his elder brother Stirling, 16-year-old, both unaware of their serious injuries, fought to help their parents and make the vehicle safe. The remoteness of their location delayed help, and critically injured Mary-Lou and Charles were eventually freed by emergency services and taken to Royal Darwin Hospital.

They fought for their lives in Royal Darwin Hospital's ICU before they were stable enough to be flown to Perth for more specialist care. Charles had suffered multiple broken bones, including spinal injuries in his neck and back. Mary-Lou was in a coma, her major head trauma resulting in a severe brain injury. She underwent two emergency, lifesaving surgeries in those first 24 hours. Surgeons worked hard to stabilise Charles, performing life-saving surgery on the crushed vertebrae in his neck. Young Willard had surgery to repair a torn bowel, and Stirling underwent surgeries on his broken leg and shoulder. Their middle brother, George, who had been on holiday interstate, flew home to wait with his grandparents and extended family for news.

Charles is a green thumb and grows locally famous hot chillies and spectacular tropical flowers. Mary-Lou starts each day with a five am, five-kilometre run before settling into a coffee and Wordle game before the school day chaos begins.

But they are most notable for the time they give to volunteering at sports, school, and fundraisers. Mary-Lou's a former CWA champion, volunteer breastfeeding counsellor, a footy team manager (and a die-hard Cowboys supporter), Chuck's been the footy club medic, and both support the coaches in any way they can. Ironically, Charles crews (and trains crew

members for) Care flight's rescue helicopters. He helps save lives daily, caring for people in their most vulnerable moments of fear and trauma. The McGregor-Shaws are committed to helping shape a safe and thriving community for all.

#### Life right now

It's been four weeks of heartache, small joys, hope and prayer. Mary-Lou, who is still in a coma, and Charles are receiving the best of medical care, but their injuries are life-changing. They face many months of medical interventions and rehabilitation in specialist care on their long road to recovery. The boys' grandparents, Bill and Maureen O'Keeffe, have relocated from their small, tight-knit community in Katherine to Perth to care for their grandsons and create as normal a life for them as possible, taking each day as it comes.

#### How can you help?

The family has been overwhelmed by love and support, which illustrates the esteem in which they are held. But financial support is needed urgently to support the boys' grandparents, Maureen and Bill O'Keeffe, who are covering the everyday expenses of caring for three teenage boys while their parents are incapacitated. That's where you come in. Any donation, no matter how insignificant you think it may be, will help pay for the extra food, clothing, and petrol for the boys' daily hospital visits for medical treatment and to visit mum and dad, and internet for remote schooling. #### Just a note about privacy

Despite being well known for all the right reasons, we know the McGregor-Shaws and the O'Keeffes are very humble and private people, and while they are recognised as givers, receiving brings discomfort. We held off launching a GoFundMe until Charles was conscious and able to communicate so he could make decisions on behalf of his beloved family. While going public makes him uncomfortable, he understands in these chaotic first few months; it's all hands on deck to help the boys maintain their schooling and routine.
